## STUCK FOR IDEAS? DON'T WORRY

First, form a core group, then think about your students and parents, what they enjoy and the skills and resources you have available. We've pulled together a selection of ideas below to get your minds working. Don't be afraid to ask the children what they would like to do.

### Shine for ShelterBox

**Estimate £200 - £300**

### Non-uniform or fancy-dress day

**Estimate £75 - £500**

Swap ties and blazers for jeans, fancy dress or even pyjamas to raise vital funds. Ask everyone who takes part to make a donation.

### Cake sale

**Estimate £40 - £100**

Everyone loves a sweet treat. Ask budding bakers to cook cakes and biscuits and sell them in the lunch room or playground at break time or after lunch.

### Face painting

**Estimate £60 - £150**

Find a face painter and get your supplies, set up at an event like sports day or set up a table for a normal school day and tell parents in advance. Have a flat-rate price for the face painting, and let kids pick what designs or animals they want.

### Read-a-thon

**Estimate £60 - £200**

Encourage family and friends to sponsor kids for each page they read in an allotted time. This event raises money and encourages reading – win, win!

### School disco

**Estimate £250 - £800**

Take over the school hall, ask around to see if parents or teachers can help with music, games and nibbles. Charge per ticket and get donations for refreshments.
