SPONSORED EVENTS AT YOUR SECONDARY SCHOOL

Getting teachers and students on board to complete challenges can bring your whole school together to raise funds. From shaving or dying hair to long-distance walks, runs or swims there's lots of different challenges you can get sponsored to do.

Off the grid Estimate £200 - £400

Unplug for 24 hours and see how your families cope without electricity. That means no TV, no phones, no laptops, no lights and no social media. Find out more at shelterbox.org/grid

Running Estimate £250 - £1,000

Set a course distance and ask as many people as possible to take part in a sponsored run. Try encouraging families and groups to form a relay team to share longer distances.

Wacky Hair Estimate £150 - £300

Haircuts and head shaves are another easy fundraising event. The wackier the better. It's also worth asking a local hairdresser if they will help out in return for some publicity in school and locally. If you're lucky they might even fix it after you're done.

Swimming Estimate £200 - £800

Whether you have a school pool or live near the sea you challenge pupils and teachers to swim a particular distance. You could even organise a fancy-dress dip with a theme like pirates or space.

Silence Estimate £50 - £100

Set students a challenge to stay silent for as long as possible. This is a really easy challenge to set up, doesn't need any specialist equipment and creates a lot of peace and quiet too!

Gross challenges Estimate £50 - £150

Persuading a popular pupil or well-known member of staff to do something silly like take a bath in baked beans or sit in the stocks and have sponges pelted at them is a fun way to raise money.
